

## Across

- New England term for any large excursion wagon built after the form of a Wagonet, with seats running lengthwise (barge)
- A type of cab typically found in London (hansom)
- 8. A light, two-wheeled, open cart peculiar to Ireland (jauntingcar)
- A sleigh with a single seat-board accommodating two persons and intended for one horse (cutter)

## Down

- A tour-wheeled covered carriage peculiar to Turkey (araba)
- Public street vehicles intended to accommodate a large number of passengers (omnibus)
- A Four-in-hand Coach, intended for private use (drag)
- 6. A funeral coach (hearse)
- Not named after a drink but rather because of its ability to whisk or turn around easily (whiskey)
- Type of cart peculiar to South Africa, usually made with pole and canvas top (cape)
