Our Itinerary:







On this truly unique and special trip, we will start in the exciting city of Buenos Aires (The "Paris of South America"). From there you will travel by private motorcoach to visit private estancias (ranches). There you will see extraordinary collections of carriages, harness, appointments, books, and, of course, horses!

Whether you travel with a family member or friend, or join us on your own, you will be cared for and pampered from the moment you arrive. Everything is included in this fascinating trip: hotels, guides, transportation, and all meals (except two dinners), so you can leave your cares at home.

Sunday, November 4:

You will be met at the airport and transferred to the Hotel Emperador (www.hotel-emperador.com.ar) in Buenos Aires. Welcome dinner in the hotel garden.

Monday, November 5:

Spend the day at a private museum in General Belgrano before traveling to Estancia La Invernada (south of the city) and our hotel, the Estancia La Candelaria. Dinner at the Estancia.

Tuesday, November 6:

After breakfast, free morning before leaving for Estancia El Solitario for the day. Return to La Candelaria for dinner.

Wednesday, November 7:

Free morning. In the afternoon, continue to San Antonio de Areco where we shall spend the following five nights at La Posada de la Plaza (www.posadadelaplaza. com). The town dates from the early eighteenth century and still preserves a great deal of the Criollo and gaucho traditions, especially among its artisans, who produce very fine silverwork and saddlery. Dinner at La Posada.

Thursday, November 8:

Visit Rosaura Passaglia's property to see museum quality collections of carriages and Argentine artifacts. Lunch in the Passaglia carriage house and return to Areco. Dinner together in Areco.

Friday, November 9:

Visit Juan Gibelli's property before returning to San Antonio de Areco for dinner. We'll see a large collection of unusual vehicles.

Saturday, November 10:

Free morning in Areco before the Entrevero (bell mare competition) in the afternoon. Dinner at the Posada.

Sunday, November 11:

Gaucho Parade. Dinner at Merti's, a local restaurant.

Monday, November 12:

After breakfast, depart to El Galpon (Guillermo Gibelli's property). After lunch, drive back to Buenos Aires. Evening free.

Tuesday, November 13:

Early departure for ferry to Montevideo, Uruguay. Arrival in Montevideo at 10:00 am; city tour and lunch; check into Hotel Cottage Carrasco (www.hotelcottage.com.uy).

Wednesday, November 14:

Visit the Fernando García Museum and Park in Montevideo and have lunch. The Museum has 31 period carriages, which were used by the aristocracy of the nineteenth century and early twentieth century. Dinner at the hotel.

Thursday, November 15:

After breakfast, departure to the port in time to take the ferry back to Buenos Aires. Return to Hotel Emperador.

Friday, November 16:

Day free, depart from International Airport in Buenos Aires.

What is the Gaucho Festival (Day of Tradition)?

Argentina's quintessential gaucho town goes wild each November to celebrate its Dia de la Tradicion (Day of Tradition). The central character is the gaucho, and to really appreciate the meat, the dancing, the handkerchief waving, and the equestrian acrobats, you'll need to study up a bit on the history of this rough, tough, "real man's man."

Sunday's parade features several hundred men, boys, and an occasional small girl from nearby fields and faraway regions, all dressed to the nines in their Sunday guacho gear and all expertly controlling beautifully groomed horses with ornate leather and silver bridles.

When you've clapped until you can clap no more, and you think it's all over and must be lunchtime soon, there come the tropillas of untamed horses, each group led by a single expert rider. It's an amazing sight for anyone, but particularly for anyone keen on all things equestrian.
